Since Terry is not here, no one is making sure that the leaf cars are being charged at night. Is it possible to have someone to make sure that they are on the chargers at night, or can we readjust the timers in the cars so we know they are charged?



It is my understanding that Terry adjusted the vehicle's settings so that they don't start charging until later in the evening, when the electrical load is less. But this does require the vehicles to be plugged in. However, I don't believe that it should be necessary to have someone go around at the end of the day and make sure the vehicles are plugged in. Vehicle operators should be reminded that regardless of what time they use one of the electric vehicles, once they have finished using it, they must remember to plug it back into the charger. Even if it was 10am, they may be the last person to use that car on that particular day.
