- Clarence Brown Theatre we ran a new conduit on the retainer wall to the irrigation sprinkler control box, to power it. Have lost power on the old piping and wiring (unable to locate the original source).
- Pratt Pavilion we unhooked 2 different ground wires from two different generators and removed the temp. ground rods; that were used for an event on Friday night.
- Lot 9 Parking lot we hooked up 2 ground wires 1) for temp. generator 2) for the stage. For the pre-game concert/party before the Orange & White game. Then after the game unhooked both and removed the temp. ground rod. Also ran 2 ext. cords from the Claxton Chiller Plant, with yellow jackets (to protect the cords) to inside Lot 9 for beer coolers for the party. Along with setting up 1 of our small portable generators (in the upper lot South end) of Lot 9 for power to the other beer stand and coolers. Then picked up all after the O/W game.
- Worked the Orange & White game to run power to the fans on both sidelines.
- Logged TN 811 tickets.
 - Laurel Substation reported the loss of power to LA1 and LA2. Found UTK LA11 main breaker at SS was tripped, along with LA1. LA2 was not tripped (closed) but no power from the main being tripped. Reset UTK LA11 and turn on to power LA2, but then LA2 tripped. Went to MH#67 on White Ave. and checked inside MH for issues. Did not see anything this time. Then went to Vista Switch on the hill near the footbridge from the 11th Street parking garage, and we used the LA3 circuit (line side) to feed the load to LA2. Then we switched all buildings; fed by LA1 circuit, to the backup circuit, via the PMH switch at the building. After we had all power to the buildings again via using backup and looking for the issue in the switches (before switching to backup).

Then turned off the 1500 KVA transformer at/near the visitor locker room. Then we re-tested the transformer, off. We then ground the way of feeding the transformer for safety. Both parties LOTO the way also. They are relocating the feeds to the new location.
- Laurel S.S. LA1 & LA2 We unground LA1 and LA2, then
 returned on UTK11 (main). We then turn on the LA1
 circuit and hold. Then we turn on the LA2 circuit and it's
 holding. Be checking the reset of the week. Plan now to
 switch LA1 buildings back to normal and off the backup
 next week. LA2 will be done on the week of the SERF
 outage.
- We met with the key shop at Jessie Harris to have them remove the core on the lock to the PMH switch. (It was hard to open) They removed the core so we were able to remove and lock and install a new one.
- We hooked up TV trucks at Sherri Lee Softball for the game. The night shift will unhook after the game.

Then reported that it was an old feed to the coach's tower and was dead and no longer needed. No idea about the concrete that is around 7' down.
