JULY IS UV SAFETY AWARENESS MONTH

July is UV Safety Awareness Month, a time dedicated to educating about the dangers of ultraviolet (UV) radiation and promoting sun safety practices. It's a reminder to protect skin and eyes from the harmful effects of UV rays, which can lead to sunburn, premature aging, and skin cancer.



Here's why UV Safety Awareness Month is important:

Sun Safety:

The primary goal is to raise awareness about the risks of excessive sun exposure (sunburn) and encourage preventative measures like using sunscreen, wearing protective clothing and sunglasses, and seeking shade. Even on cloudy days, UV rays can penetrate clouds and damage skin and eyes.

Eye Protection:

UV radiation can also damage the eyes, potentially leading to cataracts and other vision problems. Sunglasses that block UV rays are crucial for eye protection. Wearing sunglasses that block 100% of UVA and UVB rays, often labeled as "UV400" can reduce exposure. Wide-brimmed hats also offer additional protection by shading your eyes.

Skin Cancer Prevention:

Skin cancer is a serious concern, and UV exposure is a major risk factor. Skin cancer, the most common cancer in the US, is largely preventable with proper sun protection. The three main types are basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma, and melanoma. Protecting yourself from UV radiation is crucial and can be achieved through:

- Sunscreen: Use a broad-spectrum sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher, reapplying every two hours or after swimming/sweating.
- Protective Clothing: Wear long sleeves, hats, and sunglasses.
- Seek Shade: Limit sun exposure during peak hours (10 am to 4 pm).
- Avoid Tanning Beds: Tanning beds emit harmful UVA and UVB radiation.

Regular self-exams and professional skin checks are vital for early detection and treatment, especially for melanoma, the most serious form of skin cancer.

Year-Round Protection:

While July is designated as UV Safety Awareness Month, it's a reminder that sun safety is important year-round. Healthy Habits:
